IMPORTANT NDIS NEWS!

The new NDIS Pricing Arrangements and Price Limits (PAPL) for 2025-2026 have been published, and come into effect **TODAY!**

The 2025-2026 PAPL (price guide) has been published.

Here are the primary changes likely to affect you:-

- 50% Cut in the cost of travel to school, home and the community.
- New rates for Psychology, PBS and dietetics.

We might have to change the way we deliver services to you:-

- Reducing the # of sessions where we travel to clients
- Appointments may need to take place in-clinic or via Telehealth.
